

**SUBSTITUTE FOR
HOUSE BILL NO. 6276**

A bill to provide for civilian state awards; and to prescribe the powers and duties for certain state officers and entities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
2 "Michigan civilian state awards act".

3 Sec. 3. (1) The adjutant general shall receive award
4 nominations submitted under this act and determine if the nominee
5 meets the award requirements as established under this act. A
6 nomination must provide in writing an account of the occurrence
7 warranting the award and any eyewitness statement, extract from
8 official records, sketch, map, diagram, or photograph that supports
9 and amplifies the stated facts. The adjutant general shall seek out
10 and record any additional information available.



1 (2) An award nomination under this act may be submitted
2 through the department of military and veterans affairs webpage
3 that accepts nominations for the Michigan military department state
4 awards program established under section 182a of the Michigan
5 military act, 1967 PA 150, MCL 32.582a.

6 (3) An award nomination under this act may be submitted by the
7 public.

8 (4) A member of the house of representatives or senate may
9 submit an award recommendation to the chairs of the house of
10 representatives and senate committees that have responsibility for
11 military and veterans affairs.

12 Sec. 5. (1) The legislature may award the Michigan legislative
13 medal of freedom.

14 (2) The Michigan legislative medal of freedom is the highest
15 civilian award of this state. All of the following apply to this
16 medal:

17 (a) The medal must be awarded to an individual in recognition
18 of a valorous or heroic deed performed in the saving of a life, for
19 injury or death, or for threat of injury or death, incurred in the
20 service of this state or the individual's community or on behalf of
21 the health, welfare, or safety of other individuals.

22 (b) The adjutant general shall submit the following
23 information to the chairs of the house of representatives and
24 senate committees that have responsibility for military and
25 veterans affairs:

26 (i) If the adjutant general determines that a nominee does not
27 qualify for the medal, the name of the nominee and the reasons why
28 the nominee does not qualify for the medal.

29 (ii) If the adjutant general determines that a nominee does



1 qualify for the medal and the adjutant general recommends the
2 nominee for the medal, his or her recommendation, the nomination,
3 and any supporting documents.

4 (c) The medal is awarded upon passage of a concurrent
5 resolution of the legislature. The resolution may be considered
6 only during a regular session of the legislature.

7 (d) Upon passage of the resolution described in subdivision
8 (c), the speaker of the house of representatives and the majority
9 leader of the senate shall award the medal in the presence of the
10 governor, the sponsoring legislator or legislators, and the
11 representative and senator of the district where the awardee
12 resides.

13 Enacting section 1. This act does not take effect unless all
14 of the following bills of the 100th Legislature are enacted into
15 law:
