Reps. Murphy, Zelenko, Callahan, Whitmer, Jacobs, Lemmons, Kilpatrick, Spade, O’Neil, Lockwood, Kolb, McConico, Lipsey, Rich Brown, Adamini, Woodward, Hale, Jamnick, Phillips, Bogardus, Anderson, Plakas, Waters, Gielegghem, Hardman, Williams, Reeves, Thomas, Garza, Stallworth, Basham, Clarke, Clark, Hansen, Neumann, Dennis and Minore, having reserved the right to explain their nay vote, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on HB 4965 CR-1 for the following reasons:

First, the redistricting plan included for the House of Representatives in this conference report was once again developed by Republicans under a shroud in secrecy. Democratic legislators were given only a cursory description of the contents of this 457- page bill, and even this very limited information was provided only moments before this bill was brought to a vote.

Second, the public has been afforded no opportunity whatsoever to review or comment on this plan. The Legislature has failed to follow fair and conventional procedures in adopting the maps in this conference report. It has not afforded members of racial and language minority groups or communities of interest an opportunity to participate in the decision-making process, and it has refused to take the concerns of those citizens and others into account.

Third, Democrats again today attempted in conference committee to replace the flawed Republican House redistricting plan in this bill with a new version of a House redistricting plan that clearly surpasses the Republican plan in its overall compliance with MCL 4.261 and other applicable state and federal laws. Once again, Democrats demonstrated with this new plan that compliance with the law can and should result in a plan that respects the rights of the people of this state. But as has happened repeatedly throughout this process, Republicans again used their majority status to dismiss this Democratic plan out of hand, without consideration of its merits.

Fourth, the so-called ‘Special Report of the Conference Committee on HB 4965’ is a sham. This 15-page report was also drafted in secrecy and unveiled for the first time at conference committee tonight, where members were not even afforded time to read the report. There was absolutely no discussion or consideration of the contents of this report during the legislative process, formally or informally. When in conference committee Representative Kilpatrick asked if there was any public input in the development of this ‘Special Report,’ Senator Schuette responded that he (Senator Schuette) is a member of the public.

Today’s legislative activity regarding HB 4965 (CR-1) represents the shameful conclusion of a process that has disrespected the laws and the voters of this state at each step of the way.”

Rep. Schauer, having reserved the right to explain his nay vote, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on the Conference Report for House Bill 4965 for the following reasons: First, the redistricting plan included for the House of Representatives in this conference report was once again developed by Republicans under a shroud of secrecy without public input. Democratic legislators were given only a cursory description of the contents in this 457-page bill, and even this very limited information was provided only moments before this bill was brought to a vote. Second, the public has been afforded no opportunity whatsoever to review or comment on this plan. The Legislature has failed to follow fair and conventional procedures in adopting the maps in this conference report. It has not afforded members of racial and language minority groups or communities of interest an opportunity to participate in the decision-making process, and it has refused to take the concerns of those citizens and others into account. A glaring result of this in my own community is the fact that the city of Battle Creek has been split between the 62nd and 63rd House districts. This was wholly unnecessary and may cause the disenfranchisement of a small group of residents in the northwest section of the city of Battle Creek. Additionally, the two northern townships within the Battle Creek urban region—a distinct community of interest—have been split from the city of Battle Creek. Third, Democrats again today attempted in conference committee to replace the flawed Republican House redistricting plan in this bill with a new version of a House redistricting plan that clearly surpasses the Republican plan in its overall compliance with MCL 4.261 and other applicable state and federal laws. Once again, Democrats demonstrated with this plan that compliance with the law can and should result in a plan that respects the rights of the people in this state.

But as has happened repeatedly throughout this process, Republicans again used their majority status to dismiss this Democratic plan out of hand, without consideration of its merits. In The Chair: Julian

The House agreed to the title of the bill.

Rep. Williams, having reserved the right to explain his protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of Senate Bill 546, the congressional redistricting bill, because the plan violates the laws governing redistricting.

I am particularly concerned with the violations of the Congressional Redistricting Act that this Legislature passed in 1999. The 1999 Act establishes a set of mandatory guidelines for congressional redistricting, and lists them ‘in order of priority.’ Near the top of that list is a simple sentence saying, ‘Congressional district lines shall break as few county boundaries as is reasonably possible,’ followed further down the list by another simple sentence saying, ‘Congressional district lines shall break as few city and township boundaries as is reasonably possible.’

The meaning of these sentences could hardly be clearer. If a congressional districting plan breaks more county boundaries than necessary, it’s illegal. That’s pretty simple—yet the Republican majority today brazenly ignored this simple statutory command and instead passed a bill that is patently illegal. The Republicans passed a bill that breaks 10 county boundaries—after voting down a substitute that would have broken only 5 county boundaries. If it was reasonably possible to break only 5 county boundaries—and the Democrats’ substitute bill proved that it was—then obviously the Republicans’ bill did not ‘break as few county boundaries as is reasonably possible.’

Similarly, the Republicans ignored the 1999 Act’s mandate to ‘break as few city and township boundaries as is reasonably possible.’ The Republicans passed a bill that breaks 14 city and township boundaries—after voting down the substitute, which would have broken only 10 city and township boundaries. Again, the legal violation is obvious.

The map passed today is flatly illegal. It should not have passed.”

Reps. Woodward, Gielegem, Kilpatrick, Thomas, Schauer, Jamnick, Bogardus, Minore, Stallworth, Spade, Lockwood, Hale, Garza, Dennis, Callahan, Jacobs and Neumann, having reserved the right to explain their protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of Senate Bill 546 because it deviates from the criteria the Legislature set in 1999 in the Congressional Redistricting Act. I was in the Legislature when the 1999 Act passed. That Act was designed to reduce partisanship in the redistricting process. The Republicans especially were concerned about partisanship in the process, seemingly fearing that they might not control the process by the time of the 2001 redistricting.

Since they have remained in control of both legislative chambers and the governorship, however, the Republicans apparently decided partisanship was just fine. Rather than follow the criteria set forth in the Act, the Republicans decided to alter those criteria in order to create a congressional redistricting plan that will likely result in a significant increase in the number of Republican congressmen and an even more significant decrease in the number of Democratic congressmen from Michigan. This is not acceptable.

The criteria set in 1999 were important not only because they were designed to reduce partisanship but also because they minimized the number of counties that would be split into multiple districts. County residents often share common interests created by participation in a single county government. County residents also often have an expectation that they will share a common representative. Thus, it is beneficial for everyone in a county to be included in one congressional district.

Once a county is split into multiple districts that cohesion is lost. Each time it is split into additional pieces, more cohesion is lost. But it is the first county break that matters most. Therefore, the 1999 Act made clear that the number of counties that are fragmented should be minimized.

S.B. 546 abandons this part of the 1999 Act. Under S.B. 546, a redistricting plan should minimize the number of county ‘shifts,’ not the number of counties that are split. This is a deviation from the 1999 Act and is inconsistent with the goals of that Act.

Moreover, even under the method set forth in S.B. 546, it is possible to create a redistricting plan that achieves as few county splits as S.B. 546, fits equally well with the other criteria in the 1999 Act, and is far less partisan. Such a plan was introduced but was rejected. Thus, it is clear that the motive for S.B. 546 is purely partisan. This is not the basis on which a redistricting plan should be adopted and not the basis agreed on in 1999.”

Reps. Kolb and Zelenko, having reserved the right to explain their protest against passage, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of the Republican majority’s congressional redistricting bill, SB 546, for several reasons. But I wish to highlight one problem that deserves particularly serious attention.

The essence of a democratic system such as ours is that elections can, and should, provide a strong linkage between the representatives and the represented. As many of us in this chamber recognize, the fear of losing reelection is a healthy constraint on our behavior in public office, as well it should be.

That constraint, however, is meaningless if a representative is so secure that he or she loses any fear of electoral defeat. With the plan adopted today, we have created one—and only one—district that is truly competitive (the First District, in the northern part of the state), and 14 districts that are super-safe. Thus, under this plan, 93% of all Michiganians will be represented by Members of Congress who, for all practical purposes, can’t lose. With no realistic prospect that their constituents will keep them in line, these Members will be free to do as they please, regardless of whether it reflects the will of the people. Even historically massive shifts in public opinion will not alter the outcome in 14 of Michigan’s 15 districts. Instead, their representation will be foreordained by the bill we passed today.

We have overlaid the results of 32 statewide elections, held from 1992 to 2000, on these 14 new districts, for a total of 448 case studies. In every single case—literally 448 out of 448—the Republican candidates did better in every one of the 9 Republican-leaning districts than they did statewide, and the Democratic candidates did better in every one of the 5 Democratic-leaning districts than they did statewide. On average, the Republican districts were all 55% to 65% Republican and the Democratic districts were all 60% to 85% Democratic. With no districts (other than the First District) in the middle range (between 45% and 55%), there will be no competition. And with no competition, the linkage between the representatives and the represented will be broken, to the detriment of all Michiganians.”

Reps. Clark, Hardman, Phillips, Whitmer and Waters, having reserved the right to explain their protest against passage, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of Senate Bill 546 because I believe the process leading to the bill and the congressional districting plan contained in it violate the Voting Rights Act of 1965, one of the most sacred civil-rights statutes in our nation’s history.

The U.S. Department of Justice—which will be asked to ‘preclear’ this plan under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act—requires that the Legislature, when redrawing election districts, (1) ‘follow objective guidelines and fair and conventional procedures,’ (2) ‘afford members of racial and language minority groups an opportunity to participate’ in the decision-making process, and (3) take ‘the concerns of members of racial and language minority groups into account.’ 28 C.F.R. § 51.57.

The Legislature has violated all three of these requirements. Although the Congressional Redistricting Act of 1999 contains express guidelines for congressional redistricting, those guidelines have been flouted, not followed. And our conventional procedures have been shunted aside in a rush to enact this legislation. For example, last month the Republican leadership abruptly instructed all interested persons to submit their proposed districting plans by noon on Monday, June 25, or take the risk of being shut out entirely from the process. The Republican leadership failed to meet this deadline itself, and instead sprung its proposal on the Senate Reapportionment Committee and the public later that day, at the outset of the committee's one and only hearing on the map. Although the Republican bill was more than 160 pages long, and the Republican map was obviously drawn on a computer, the bill's sponsors refused to provide anyone with a computerized version of the map (contrary to the practice of most states, which put these maps on their Web sites); that made it nearly impossible to figure out, for example, the African-American percentages in any of the districts. When the Detroit chapter of the NAACP asked for 30 days to review the map, its request was denied. Moreover, a statewide series of field hearings to debate the merits of competing plans—including a hearing in Detroit—was promised in late March, but cancelled without warning.

Aside from the irregular process leading to its enactment, the plan itself is also violative of the Voting Rights Act. It systematically discriminates against voters and officeholders affiliated with the Democratic Party, which regularly receives 90% or better support from African-Americans in Michigan (but less than 50% support from whites in Michigan). The plan dilutes the voting strength of Detroit's blacks by placing them in the same district as overwhelmingly white Democratic Downriver communities, thus making it more difficult for blacks in Detroit to affect the outcome in the all-important Democratic primaries. And it isolates many of our state's mid-sized black communities, such as the 26 thousand African-Americans in Pontiac, in districts that are overwhelmingly Republican, thus denying these black citizens any opportunity to participate meaningfully in congressional politics or to affect the outcomes of congressional elections. And the plan shows similar disdain for language minorities—for example, by splitting Dearborn's Arab community right down the middle."

Rep. Rich Brown, having reserved the right to explain his protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

"Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of Senate Bill 546 because the congressional districting plan it contains is an act of sheer partisanship.

Over the years, the State of Michigan and its citizenry have been well served by one of the most senior—and hence most powerful—congressional delegations in the country. It is well known that the U.S. House of Representatives is organized by seniority, with the most experienced Members getting the best committee assignments and the most clout in and with the leadership. That power, in turn, works to the benefit of the people back home. It is not a coincidence that federal dollars are spent disproportionately in the districts of the most senior Members of Congress.

Michigan has greatly benefited from the seniority of its congressional delegation. Today, the two most senior members of the House are both Michiganians. On a per capita basis, the Michigan delegation is one of the most senior in the entire nation. And the people of Michigan have profited from that.

The plan passed today, however, threatens our gains. Although the homes of the 15 incumbents seeking reelection could easily have been placed in separate districts—indeed, that is precisely what the Democrats' substitute amendment would have done—the Republicans put partisan gain over the welfare of Michigan and its people. They would rather create two open seats, to elect two Republican freshmen, than to sustain the seniority that has meant so much to our State.

Therefore, the Republican plan placed *six* Democratic incumbents in just three districts, while pairing *zero* Republican incumbents. Congressman Dingell and Congresswoman Rivers are paired in the 15th District; Congressman Kildee and Congressman Barcia are paired in the 5th District; and Congressman Bonior and Congressman Levin are paired in the 12th District. The seven Republican incumbents each get their own district.

That kind of discrepancy is a classic earmark of partisan gerrymandering. It is bad enough under any circumstances. But here, where it threatens the reelection prospects of some of Michigan's, and the Nation's, most longstanding congressional representatives, it is worse than unfair. It is destructive to the interests of all forward-thinking Michiganians."

Rep. McConico, having reserved the right to explain his protest against passage, made the following statement:

"Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of Senate Bill 546 because the congressional districting plan it contains is an act of sheer partisanship.

Over the years, the State of Michigan and its citizenry have been well served by one of the most senior—and hence most powerful—congressional delegations in the country. It is well known that the U.S. House of Representatives is organized by seniority, with the most experienced Members getting the best committee assignments and the most clout in and with the leadership. That power, in turn, works to the benefit of the people back home. It is not a coincidence that federal dollars are spent disproportionately in the districts of the most senior Members of Congress.

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That kind of discrepancy is a classic earmark of partisan gerrymandering. It is bad enough under any circumstances. But here, where it threatens the reelection prospects of some of Michigan's, and the Nation's, most longstanding congressional representatives, it is worse than unfair. It is stupid and destructive to the interests of all forward-thinking Michiganians."

Rep. Anderson, having reserved the right to explain his protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

"Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on passage of Senate Bill 546 because it violates the Michigan Constitution. In 1999, this Legislature passed the Congressional Redistricting Act to establish criteria for redistricting. Senate Bill 546 alters those criteria and uses the altered criteria as a basis for creating new congressional districts for the 2002 and subsequent congressional elections. The immediate implementation of new redistricting criteria in S.B. 546 violates three separate provisions of the Michigan Constitution.

First, the Michigan Constitution forbids immediate implementation of Acts that have been passed by less than a 2/3 majority. Mich. Const. Art. 4, § 27. S.B. 546 passed by less than a 2/3 majority in the Senate and it was readily apparent to me that it would also garner less than a 2/3 vote in the House, as it in fact did. Thus, the Constitution forbids immediate implementation of any new redistricting criteria contained in S.B. 546. Yet S.B. 546 contains just such criteria and is intended to be implemented immediately.

The Congressional Redistricting Act of 1999 established as a fundamental criterion for redistricting that 'congressional district lines shall break as few county boundaries as is reasonably possible.' (Mich. Comp. Laws § 3.63(c)) S.B. 546 purports to interpret this criterion. However, the 1999 Act needs no interpretation. It is readily apparent that under the 1999 Act, a redistricting plan should minimize the number of counties that are divided and placed in more than one district. S.B. 546 offers an entirely different interpretation, one that involves an extremely complex, and perhaps incomprehensible, method of counting county breaks. Whatever this method is, it is clear that it is a different method than the one in the 1999 Act and, in actuality, replaces the criterion from that Act with a new one. This Legislature has no authority to adopt such new criterion and use it for redistricting for 2002 congressional elections.

Second, S.B. 546 also violates the Michigan Constitution's prohibition against amendment by reference. S.B. 546 amends the 1999 Congressional Redistricting Act while purporting to interpret that Act. It does not republish and re-enact the prior legislation as the Constitution requires. Mich. Const., art. 4, § 25. It is important that legislation that directly revises prior laws be clear that it is doing so. S.B. 546 is not clear, as it purports merely to be explaining prior law.

Finally, S.B. 546 violates the two-subject rule. Mich. Const., art 4, § 24. The bill both creates new criteria for redistricting and establishes new congressional districts.

The Republicans' willingness to flout constitutional requirements in passing this bill appears to stem from the overarching motive behind the bill: to create a redistricting plan designed to maximize Republican representation in Congress. When the Legislature passed the Congressional Redistricting Act in 1999, we did so in order to reduce partisanship in the redistricting process. We understood that the redistricting criteria we were enacting would bind the 2001 Legislature in the absence of a 2/3 vote. Apparently we were wrong. The Republicans not only are willing to depart from these criteria but are also willing to depart from the Michigan Constitution. I cannot support such a departure."

Rep. Lipsey, having reserved the right to explain his protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

"Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of the congressional redistricting bill, SB 546, because it is founded on a completely untenable interpretation of the 1999 Congressional Redistricting Act.

The 1999 Act states: ‘Congressional district lines shall break as few county boundaries as it reasonably possible.’ The clearest reading of that language is that a plan that breaks the boundaries of 5 counties is preferable to a plan that breaks the boundaries of 6 counties, which is preferable to a plan that breaks 7 counties’ boundaries, etc., etc. Yet today—in the face of a substitute plan that broke only 5 county boundaries—the Republican majority passed a plan that broke 10 county boundaries. The Democrats’ substitute plan would have broken the boundaries of only Kent, Macomb, Oakland, Washtenaw, and Wayne Counties. The Republicans’ plan instead broke the boundaries of twice as many counties—those five plus another five—Allegan, Bay, Calhoun, Saginaw, and Shiawassee.

The 1999 Act could have been written to minimize not the number of counties whose boundaries are broken, but the number of pieces into which the counties are broken. That, of course, is *not* what the Legislature enacted in 1999. But even if it had enacted such a requirement—or even if the 1999 Act were misread to demand the minimization of the number of county *parts*, the plan passed today would be illegal. It breaks its 10 broken counties into 24 pieces. By contrast, the substitute bill that the House voted against today broke 5 counties into just 21 pieces. Therefore, even under this alternative counting method, the Republicans’ plan is clearly illegal.

To avoid this, the Republicans have cooked up a counting system with no foundation whatsoever in either the statutory language or the Act’s legislative history. They claim that if a county is broken into 2 pieces, that counts as one ‘county break.’ But if the county is broken into 3 pieces, that counts as *three* ‘county breaks,’ and if the county is broken into 4 pieces, that counts as four ‘county breaks,’ and so on and so forth. That counting method effectively penalizes any plan where a county is broken into 3 or more pieces—unless the county is Wayne County, apparently.

The principal virtue of this peculiar counting method is that the map the Republicans wanted to draw in order to accomplish their partisan ends ‘scores’ well under it. And the method’s principal defect is equally obvious: It conflicts with the 1999 Act and therefore violates state law. Thus, I felt compelled to vote against the plan founded on this illegal counting method.”

Reps. Basham, O’Neil and Plakas, having reserved the right to explain their protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on Senate Bill 546 because it splits the 21 Downriver communities into four separate districts. The 21 Downriver communities constitute a single definable region. In a recent survey, many more residents named the Downriver region as their home than named the city in which they lived. Indeed, a majority of residents in these communities—52% designated Downriver as their home. Only 33% named the city in which they lived as their home.

The strong connection residents feel to the Downriver region results from the similar demographic and socioeconomic population bases of the communities in the region and from the many common areas of concern shared by these communities. The extensive concerns shared by these communities are apparent from the numerous organizations that are regional in nature. These include the Downriver Community Conference, Downriver Mutual Aid, Downriver Board of Realtors, and Southern Wayne County Chamber of Commerce. Downriver cultural organizations include the Downriver Council for the Arts and Downriver Town Hall and Seaway Chorale. Regional projects include the Downriver Summit and Downriver Waterfront Taskforce.

The common areas of concern shared by the Downriver communities can best be addressed if they share a Representative. But S.B. 546 divides these communities into four separate districts. That is why a number of Downriver mayors and government officials, as well as the President of the Southern Wayne County Chamber of Commerce, came to the hearing of the House Committee on Redistricting and Elections to testify against S.B. 546. It is also why the Southern Wayne County Chamber of Commerce, the Downriver Communities Conference and several cities passed resolutions opposing the plan.

There is no reason to split the Downriver communities into four districts. The Democrats introduced a redistricting plan on the floor that only splits the communities into two district and places almost all of the communities in a single district.

In contrast, S.B. 546 completely ignores the common interests of the Downriver communities. I cannot support it.”

Reps. Murphy and Adamini, having reserved the right to explain their protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on the congressional redistricting bill, SB 546, because it is a partisan gerrymander, pure and simple. A fair redistricting plan should reflect the will of the electorate—not the will of the redistricters. This, unfortunately, is an unfair plan.

In federal elections, Michigan is a competitive state, but it leans somewhat Democratic and appears to be getting more Democratic with each passing year. In the 1980s, Republican presidential candidates did better in Michigan than they did nationwide. Since that time, Democratic presidential candidates have prevailed in all three presidential elections here in Michigan, and in 1996 and 2000 their winning margins here exceeded their margins nationwide by about 5 points.

As of last November, Democrats now hold both U.S. Senate seats from Michigan. And at the congressional level, Democrats garnered about 53.7% of the major-party vote five years ago, and 54.9% last year. A good redistricting plan would accurately reflect these figures and the growing strength of Michigan's Democratic electorate.

For example, under the old plan adopted by a unanimous (and bipartisan) panel of federal judges in 1992, Al Gore carried 10 of the 16 districts in the 2000 presidential election and Debbie Stabenow carried 9 of the 16 districts in the 2000 senatorial election—roughly in line with their winning margins in the statewide popular vote. Under the plan proposed by the Democrats today—but defeated by the Republican majority—Gore and Stabenow would have carried 8 of the 15, and 6 of the 15, districts, respectively. By contrast, under the plan passed by the Republicans, Gore and Stabenow would have carried only 5 of the 15 districts. In other words, under the Republican map, Democrats could get a majority of the vote statewide yet carry no more than one *third* of the congressional districts. That is the epitome of a partisan gerrymander.

Because the plan it contains is heavily biased to discriminate against, and dilute the voting strength of, Democratic voters, I voted against SB 546. Redistricting should serve democracy, not thwart it.”

The House agreed to the title of the bill.

Reps. Adamini, Lemmons and Zelenko, having reserved the right to explain their protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of Senate Bill 546, the congressional redistricting bill, because the plan violates the laws governing redistricting.

I am particularly concerned with the violations of the Congressional Redistricting Act that this Legislature passed in 1999. The 1999 Act establishes a set of mandatory guidelines for congressional redistricting, and lists them ‘in order of priority.’ Near the top of that list is a simple sentence saying, ‘Congressional district lines shall break as few county boundaries as is reasonably possible,’ followed further down the list by another simple sentence saying, ‘Congressional district lines shall break as few city and township boundaries as is reasonably possible.’

The meaning of these sentences could hardly be clearer. If a congressional districting plan breaks more county boundaries than necessary, it’s illegal. That’s pretty simple—yet the Republican majority today brazenly ignored this simple statutory command and instead passed a bill that is patently illegal. The Republicans passed a bill that breaks 10 county boundaries—after voting down a substitute that would have broken only 5 county boundaries. If it was reasonably possible to break only 5 county boundaries—and the Democrats’ substitute bill proved that it was—then obviously the Republicans’ bill did not ‘break as few county boundaries as is reasonably possible.’

Similarly, the Republicans ignored the 1999 Act’s mandate to ‘break as few city and township boundaries as is reasonably possible.’ The Republicans passed a bill that breaks 14 city and township boundaries—after voting down the substitute, which would have broken only 10 city and township boundaries. Again, the legal violation is obvious.

The map passed today is flatly illegal. It should not have passed.”

Reps. Kolb and Jacobs, having reserved the right to explain their protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of Senate Bill 546 because the congressional districting plan it contains is an act of sheer partisanship.

Over the years, the State of Michigan and its citizenry have been well served by one of the most senior—and hence most powerful—congressional delegations in the country. It is well known that the U.S. House of Representatives is organized by seniority, with the most experienced Members getting the best committee assignments and the most clout in and with the leadership. That power, in turn, works to the benefit of the people back home. It is not a coincidence that federal dollars are spent disproportionately in the districts of the most senior Members of Congress.

Michigan has greatly benefited from the seniority of its congressional delegation. Today, the two most senior members of the House are both Michiganians. On a per capita basis, the Michigan delegation is one of the most senior in the entire nation. And the people of Michigan have profited from that.

The plan passed today, however, threatens our gains. Although the homes of the 15 incumbents seeking reelection could easily have been placed in separate districts—indeed, that is precisely what the Democrats’ substitute amendment would have done—the Republicans put partisan gain over the welfare of Michigan and its people. They would rather create two open seats, to elect two Republican freshmen, than to sustain the seniority that has meant so much to our State.

Therefore, the Republican plan placed *six* Democratic incumbents in just three districts, while pairing *zero* Republican incumbents. Congressman Dingell and Congresswoman Rivers are paired in the 15th District; Congressman Kildee and Congressman Barcia are paired in the 5th District; and Congressman Bonior and Congressman Levin are paired in the 12th District. The seven Republican incumbents each get their own district.

That kind of discrepancy is a classic earmark of partisan gerrymandering. It is bad enough under any circumstances. But here, where it threatens the reelection prospects of some of Michigan's, and the Nation's, most longstanding congressional representatives, it is worse than unfair. It is destructive to the interests of all forward-thinking Michiganders."

Rep. Anderson, having reserved the right to explain his protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

"Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on the congressional redistricting bill, SB 546, because it is a partisan gerrymander, pure and simple. A fair redistricting plan should reflect the will of the electorate—not the will of the redistricters. This, unfortunately, is an unfair plan.

In federal elections, Michigan is a competitive state, but it leans somewhat Democratic and appears to be getting more Democratic with each passing year. In the 1980s, Republican presidential candidates did better in Michigan than they did nationwide. Since that time, Democratic presidential candidates have prevailed in all three presidential elections here in Michigan, and in 1996 and 2000 their winning margins here exceeded their margins nationwide by about 5 points.

As of last November, Democrats now hold both U.S. Senate seats from Michigan. And at the congressional level, Democrats garnered about 53.7% of the major-party vote five years ago, and 54.9% last year. A good redistricting plan would accurately reflect these figures and the growing strength of Michigan's Democratic electorate.

For example, under the old plan adopted by a unanimous (and bipartisan) panel of federal judges in 1992, Al Gore carried 10 of the 16 districts in the 2000 presidential election and Debbie Stabenow carried 9 of the 16 districts in the 2000 senatorial election—roughly in line with their winning margins in the statewide popular vote. Under the plan proposed by the Democrats today—but defeated by the Republican majority—Gore and Stabenow would have carried 8 of the 15, and 6 of the 15, districts, respectively. By contrast, under the plan passed by the Republicans, Gore and Stabenow would have carried only 5 of the 15 districts. In other words, under the Republican map, Democrats could get a majority of the vote statewide yet carry no more than one *third* of the congressional districts. That is the epitome of a partisan gerrymander.

Because the plan it contains is heavily biased to discriminate against, and dilute the voting strength of, Democratic voters, I voted against SB 546. Redistricting should serve democracy, not thwart it."

Reps. Williams and Thomas, having reserved the right to explain their protest against passage, made the following statement:

"Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of the Republican majority's congressional redistricting bill, SB 546, for several reasons. But I wish to highlight one problem that deserves particularly serious attention.

The essence of a democratic system such as ours is that elections can, and should, provide a strong linkage between the representatives and the represented. As many of us in this chamber recognize, the fear of losing reelection is a healthy constraint on our behavior in public office, as well it should be.

That constraint, however, is meaningless if a representative is so secure that he or she loses any fear of electoral defeat. With the plan adopted today, we have created one—and only one—district that is truly competitive (the First District, in the northern part of the state), and 14 districts that are super-safe. Thus, under this plan, 93% of all Michiganders will be represented by Members of Congress who, for all practical purposes, can't lose. With no realistic prospect that their constituents will keep them in line, these Members will be free to do as they please, regardless of whether it reflects the will of the people. Even historically massive shifts in public opinion will not alter the outcome in 14 of Michigan's 15 districts. Instead, their representation will be foreordained by the bill we passed today.

We have overlaid the results of 32 statewide elections, held from 1992 to 2000, on these 14 new districts, for a total of 448 case studies. In every single case—literally 448 out of 448—the Republican candidates did better in every one of the 9 Republican-leaning districts than they did statewide, and the Democratic candidates did better in every one of the 5 Democratic-leaning districts than they did statewide. On average, the Republican districts were all 55% to 65% Republican and the Democratic districts were all 60% to 85% Democratic. With no districts (other than the First District) in the middle range (between 45% and 55%), there will be no competition. And with no competition, the linkage between the representatives and the represented will be broken, to the detriment of all Michiganders."

Reps. Whitmer and Rich Brown, having reserved the right to explain their protest against passage, made the following statement:

"Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted against the final version of SB 546 because it relies on an incoherent methodology for counting county breaks. Under the 1999 Congressional Redistricting Act, it is important to minimize county breaks during redistricting.

SB 546 sets out a new method for counting county breaks that is different than is set forth in the clear language of the 1999 Congressional Redistricting Act. Because SB 546 has been rushed through the legislative process with no deliberation, this new method is largely incomprehensible. Moreover, to the extent that it can be understood, it does not appear consistent with the Republicans' explanation of that method.

The method for counting county breaks in SB 546 is based on county "shifts." SB 546 does not explain what constitutes a county shift. But it appears that each time a district includes part of a county, that counts as a shift.

The bill does not stick to this criterion, however. The bill exempts from this counting method counties in which one part of the county becomes part of one district and the rest of the county becomes part of a second district. Under the exemption, this counts as one county split rather than two, as would be the case in the absence of the exemption. There is no apparent justification for the exemption.

In explaining their map, the Republicans did not even appear to stick to their own criteria. For example, if a district falls entirely within a county and the rest of the county is in another district (or more than one district), the Republicans did not count this as a county break. Nothing in SB 546 says that this should be so.

Another example is the Republicans' view of District 12. The Republicans do not seem to view the part of Oakland County that is in District 12 as being shifted to District 12. They therefore do not consider Oakland County to be broken by District 12. There is again no explanation for this. It appears to be entirely arbitrary.

It is unacceptable to adopt new redistricting guidelines that, because of a rushed legislative process, make little sense, and, to the extent they do make sense, do not comport with a sensible policy view of what should be counted. It is even worse that the Republicans' explanation of how this methodology is applied is inconsistent with what those guidelines appear to say."

Reps. Waters, Clark and Murphy, having reserved the right to explain their protest against passage, made the following statement:

"Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of Senate Bill 546 because I believe the process leading to the bill and the congressional districting plan contained in it violate the Voting Rights Act of 1965, one of the most sacred civil-rights statutes in our nation's history.

The U.S. Department of Justice—which will be asked to 'preclear' this plan under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act—requires that the Legislature, when redrawing election districts, (1) 'follow objective guidelines and fair and conventional procedures,' (2) 'afford members of racial and language minority groups an opportunity to participate' in the decision-making process, and (3) take 'the concerns of members of racial and language minority groups into account.' 28 C.F.R. § 51.57.

The Legislature has violated all three of these requirements. Although the Congressional Redistricting Act of 1999 contains express guidelines for congressional redistricting, those guidelines have been flouted, not followed. And our conventional procedures have been shunted aside in a rush to enact this legislation. For example, last month the Republican leadership abruptly instructed all interested persons to submit their proposed districting plans by noon on Monday, June 25, or take the risk of being shut out entirely from the process. The Republican leadership failed to meet this deadline itself, and instead sprung its proposal on the Senate Reapportionment Committee and the public later that day, at the outset of the committee's one and only hearing on the map. Although the Republican bill was more than 160 pages long, and the Republican map was obviously drawn on a computer, the bill's sponsors refused to provide anyone with a computerized version of the map (contrary to the practice of most states, which put these maps on their Web sites); that made it nearly impossible to figure out, for example, the African-American percentages in any of the districts. When the Detroit chapter of the NAACP asked for 30 days to review the map, its request was denied. Moreover, a statewide series of field hearings to debate the merits of competing plans—including a hearing in Detroit—was promised in late March, but cancelled without warning.

Aside from the irregular process leading to its enactment, the plan itself is also violative of the Voting Rights Act. It systematically discriminates against voters and officeholders affiliated with the Democratic Party, which regularly receives 90% or better support from African-Americans in Michigan (but less than 50% support from whites in Michigan). The plan dilutes the voting strength of Detroit's blacks by placing them in the same district as overwhelmingly white Democratic Downriver communities, thus making it more difficult for blacks in Detroit to affect the outcome in the all-important Democratic primaries. And it isolates many of our state's mid-sized black communities, such as the 26 thousand African-Americans in Pontiac, in districts that are overwhelmingly Republican, thus denying these black citizens any opportunity to participate meaningfully in congressional politics or to affect the outcomes of congressional elections. And the plan shows similar disdain for language minorities—for example, by splitting Dearborn's Arab community right down the middle."

Reps. Hansen and Lipsey, having reserved the right to explain their protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

"Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of the congressional redistricting bill, SB 546, because it is founded on a completely untenable interpretation of the 1999 Congressional Redistricting Act.

The 1999 Act states: ‘Congressional district lines shall break as few county boundaries as it reasonably possible.’ The clearest reading of that language is that a plan that breaks the boundaries of 5 counties is preferable to a plan that breaks the boundaries of 6 counties, which is preferable to a plan that breaks 7 counties’ boundaries, etc., etc. Yet today—in the face of a substitute plan that broke only 5 county boundaries—the Republican majority passed a plan that broke 10 county boundaries. The Democrats’ substitute plan would have broken the boundaries of only Kent, Macomb, Oakland, Washtenaw, and Wayne Counties. The Republicans’ plan instead broke the boundaries of twice as many counties—those five plus another five—Allegan, Bay, Calhoun, Saginaw, and Shiawassee.

The 1999 Act could have been written to minimize not the number of counties whose boundaries are broken, but the number of pieces into which the counties are broken. That, of course, is *not* what the Legislature enacted in 1999. But even if it had enacted such a requirement—or even if the 1999 Act were misread to demand the minimization of the number of county *parts*, the plan passed today would be illegal. It breaks its 10 broken counties into 24 pieces. By contrast, the substitute bill that the House voted against today broke 5 counties into just 21 pieces. Therefore, even under this alternative counting method, the Republicans’ plan is clearly illegal.

To avoid this, the Republicans have cooked up a counting system with no foundation whatsoever in either the statutory language or the Act’s legislative history. They claim that if a county is broken into 2 pieces, that counts as one ‘county break.’ But if the county is broken into 3 pieces, that counts as *three* ‘county breaks,’ and if the county is broken into 4 pieces, that counts as four ‘county breaks,’ and so on and so forth. That counting method effectively penalizes any plan where a county is broken into 3 or more pieces—unless the county is Wayne County, apparently.

The principal virtue of this peculiar counting method is that the map the Republicans wanted to draw in order to accomplish their partisan ends ‘scores’ well under it. And the method’s principal defect is equally obvious: It conflicts with the 1999 Act and therefore violates state law. Thus, I felt compelled to vote against the plan founded on this illegal counting method.”

Reps. Jannick, Hale, Stallworth, Wojno, Dennis, Woodward, Kilpatrick, Thomas, Garza and Callahan, having reserved the right to explain their protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on final passage of Senate Bill 546 because it deviates from the criteria the Legislature set in 1999 in the Congressional Redistricting Act. I was in the Legislature when the 1999 Act passed. That Act was designed to reduce partisanship in the redistricting process. The Republicans especially were concerned about partisanship in the process, seemingly fearing that they might not control the process by the time of the 2001 redistricting.

Since they have remained in control of both legislative chambers and the governorship, however, the Republicans apparently decided partisanship was just fine. Rather than follow the criteria set forth in the Act, the Republicans decided to alter those criteria in order to create a congressional redistricting plan that will likely result in a significant increase in the number of Republican congressmen and an even more significant decrease in the number of Democratic congressmen from Michigan. This is not acceptable.

The criteria set in 1999 were important not only because they were designed to reduce partisanship but also because they minimized the number of counties that would be split into multiple districts. County residents often share common interests created by participation in a single county government. County residents also often have an expectation that they will share a common representative. Thus, it is beneficial for everyone in a county to be included in one congressional district.

Once a county is split into multiple districts that cohesion is lost. Each time it is split into additional pieces, more cohesion is lost. But it is the first county break that matters most. Therefore, the 1999 Act made clear that the number of counties that are fragmented should be minimized.

S.B. 546 abandons this part of the 1999 Act. Under S.B. 546, a redistricting plan should minimize the number of county ‘shifts,’ not the number of counties that are split. This is a deviation from the 1999 Act and is inconsistent with the goals of that Act.

Moreover, even under the method set forth in S.B. 546, it is possible to create a redistricting plan that achieves as few county splits as S.B. 546, fits equally well with the other criteria in the 1999 Act, and is far less partisan. Such a plan was introduced but was rejected. Thus, it is clear that the motive for S.B. 546 is purely partisan. This is not the basis on which a redistricting plan should be adopted and not the basis agreed on in 1999.”

Reps. Minore, Lockwood, Gielegem, Bogardus, Neumann and Spade, having reserved the right to explain their protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on passage of Senate Bill 546 because it violates the Michigan Constitution. In 1999, this Legislature passed the Congressional Redistricting Act to establish criteria for redistricting. Senate Bill 546 alters those criteria and uses the altered criteria as a basis for creating new congressional districts for the 2002 and subsequent congressional elections. The immediate implementation of new redistricting criteria in S.B. 546 violates three separate provisions of the Michigan Constitution.

First, the Michigan Constitution forbids immediate implementation of Acts that have been passed by less than a 2/3 majority. Mich. Const. Art. 4, § 27. S.B. 546 passed by less than a 2/3 majority in the Senate and it was readily apparent to me that it would also garner less than a 2/3 vote in the House, as it in fact did. Thus, the Constitution forbids immediate implementation of any new redistricting criteria contained in S.B. 546. Yet S.B. 546 contains just such criteria and is intended to be implemented immediately.

The Congressional Redistricting Act of 1999 established as a fundamental criterion for redistricting that ‘congressional district lines shall break as few county boundaries as is reasonably possible.’ (Mich. Comp. Laws § 3.63(c)) S.B. 546 purports to interpret this criterion. However, the 1999 Act needs no interpretation. It is readily apparent that under the 1999 Act, a redistricting plan should minimize the number of counties that are divided and placed in more than one district. S.B. 546 offers an entirely different interpretation, one that involves an extremely complex, and perhaps incomprehensible, method of counting county breaks. Whatever this method is, it is clear that it is a different method than the one in the 1999 Act and, in actuality, replaces the criterion from that Act with a new one. This Legislature has no authority to adopt such new criterion and use it for redistricting for 2002 congressional elections.

Second, S.B. 546 also violates the Michigan Constitution’s prohibition against amendment by reference. S.B. 546 amends the 1999 Congressional Redistricting Act while purporting to interpret that Act. It does not republish and re-enact the prior legislation as the Constitution requires. Mich. Const., art. 4, § 25. It is important that legislation that directly revises prior laws be clear that it is doing so. S.B. 546 is not clear, as it purports merely to be explaining prior law.

Finally, S.B. 546 violates the two-subject rule. Mich. Const., art 4, § 24. The bill both creates new criteria for redistricting and establishes new congressional districts.

The Republicans’ willingness to flout constitutional requirements in passing this bill appears to stem from the overarching motive behind the bill: to create a redistricting plan designed to maximize Republican representation in Congress. When the Legislature passed the Congressional Redistricting Act in 1999, we did so in order to reduce partisanship in the redistricting process. We understood that the redistricting criteria we were enacting would bind the 2001 Legislature in the absence of a 2/3 vote. Apparently we were wrong. The Republicans not only are willing to depart from these criteria but are also willing to depart from the Michigan Constitution. I cannot support such a departure.”

Reps Basham, having reserved the right to explain his protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on Senate Bill 546 because it splits the 21 Downriver communities into four separate districts. The 21 Downriver communities constitute a single definable region. In a recent survey, many more residents named the Downriver region as their home than named the city in which they lived. Indeed, a majority of residents in these communities—52% designated Downriver as their home. Only 33% named the city in which they lived as their home.

The strong connection residents feel to the Downriver region results from the similar demographic and socioeconomic population bases of the communities in the region and from the many common areas of concern shared by these communities. The extensive concerns shared by these communities are apparent from the numerous organizations that are regional in nature. These include the Downriver Community Conference, Downriver Mutual Aid, Downriver Board of Realtors, and Southern Wayne County Chamber of Commerce. Downriver cultural organizations include the Downriver Council for the Arts and Downriver Town Hall and Seaway Chorale. Regional projects include the Downriver Summit and Downriver Waterfront Taskforce.

The common areas of concern shared by the Downriver communities can best be addressed if they share a Representative. But S.B. 546 divides these communities into four separate districts. That is why a number of Downriver mayors and government officials, as well as the President of the Southern Wayne County Chamber of Commerce, came to the hearing of the House Committee on Redistricting and Elections to testify against S.B. 546. It is also why the Southern Wayne County Chamber of Commerce, the Downriver Communities Conference and several cities passed resolutions opposing the plan.

There is no reason to split the Downriver communities into four districts. The Democrats introduced a redistricting plan on the floor that only splits the communities into two district and places almost all of the communities in a single district.

In contrast, S.B. 546 completely ignores the common interests of the Downriver communities. I cannot support it.”

Was read a second time, and the question being on the adoption of the proposed substitute (H-2) previously recommended by the Committee on Insurance and Financial Services,

The substitute (H-2) was adopted, a majority of the members serving voting therefor.

Rep. Richardville moved that the bill be placed on the order of Third Reading of Bills.

The motion prevailed.

PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

GENERAL SECTIONS

Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources under part 1 for fiscal year 2001-2002 is \$324,596,319.00 and state spending from state resources to be paid to local units of government for fiscal year 2001-2002 is \$319,596,319.00. The itemized statement below identifies appropriations from which spending to local units of government will occur:

Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this act are subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

Sec. 208. Unless otherwise specified, the department of career development shall continue to pilot the use of the Internet to fulfill the reporting requirements of this act. This may include transmission of reports via electronic mail to the recipients identified for each reporting requirement or it may include placement of reports on the Internet or legislative Intranet site. The senate and house appropriations subcommittees and senate and house fiscal agencies shall be notified in writing of the Internet or Intranet site of any such report. Quarterly, the department of career development shall provide to each member of the senate and house appropriations subcommittees, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the state budget office both an electronic and paper copy listing of the reports submitted during the most recent 3-month period, along with each report's Internet or Intranet site, if any.

Sec. 209. Funds appropriated in part 1 should not be used for the purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if competitively priced and of comparable quality American goods and services, or both, are available. Preference should be given to goods and services, or both, manufactured or provided by Michigan businesses if they are competitively priced and of comparable value.

Sec. 210. The principal executive officer of each community college receiving appropriations in part 1 shall take all reasonable steps to ensure businesses in deprived and depressed communities compete for and perform contracts to provide services or supplies, or both. Each principal executive officer shall strongly encourage firms with which the community college contracts to subcontract with certified businesses in depressed and deprived communities for services, supplies, or both.

Sec. 211. (1) The money appropriated in this act is appropriated for community colleges with fiscal years ending June 30, 2002, and shall be paid out of the state treasury and distributed by the state treasurer to the respective community colleges in 11 monthly installments on the sixteenth of each month, or the next succeeding business day, beginning with October 16, 2001. Each community college shall accrue its July and August 2002 payments to its institutional fiscal year ending June 30, 2002. However, if a community college fails to submit all verified Michigan community colleges activities classification structure data for school year 2000-2001 to the department of career development by November 1, 2001, the monthly installments shall be withheld from that community college until those data are submitted. The department of career development shall publish the activities classification structure data book for Michigan community colleges on or before March 1, 2002, for use by the legislature during budget development for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2003. The amount from the money appropriated in part 1 that is allocated under section 103 to address the special needs of at-risk students shall be paid in full by the state treasurer by November 1, 2001. The amount distributed to a community college or department shall not exceed the net state allocation authorized by this act.

(2) Except as otherwise provided by law, each of the amounts appropriated shall be used solely for the respective purposes stated in this act. The money appropriated by this act may be used to match the cost of any available programs under the Carl D. Perkins vocational and applied technology education act, Public Law 88-210, 98 Stat. 2435, including local administration.

Sec. 212. (1) The auditor general or an independent public accounting firm appointed by the auditor general shall audit data for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2001, as submitted to the department of career development by 7 randomly selected community colleges. A community college shall maintain and provide those records necessary for the auditor general or certified public accountant appointed by the auditor general to determine the accuracy of the reported data. The audits shall be based upon the definitions and requirements contained in the Manual for Uniform Financial Reporting, Michigan Public Community Colleges, published by the Michigan state board of education in 1981, and the Activities Classification Structure Manual for Michigan Community Colleges, 1996 revision of the final report of the activities classification structure task force (July 1981), published by the department of education. Before the submission of a final audit report, a community college may appeal the findings of the preliminary report under an appeal process to be established by the auditor general. The auditor general shall submit a report of the findings to the house and senate appropriations committees, the department of career development, and the state budget director before June 1, 2002.

(2) The auditor general or a certified public accountant appointed by the auditor general shall conduct not less than 3 performance audits of community colleges but may conduct more if the auditor general considers it necessary.

(3) Not more than 60 days after an audit report is released by the office of the auditor general, the principal executive officer of the community college that was audited shall submit to the house and senate appropriations committees, the house and senate fiscal agencies, the department of career development, the auditor general, and the state budget director a plan to comply with audit recommendations. The plan shall contain projected dates and resources required, if any, to achieve compliance with the audit recommendations, or a documented explanation of the college's noncompliance with the audit recommendations concerning the matters on which the audited community college and office of the auditor general disagree.

(4) A community college whose audited activities classification structure data is significantly different than the data used to determine state aid under this act shall return any overappropriated money as provided in this section. The department of career development shall compare formula computations for the audited colleges using pre- and post-audit data. If the state allocation is 2% or more than the post-audit allocation amount, the college shall return the excess money. The returned money shall be redistributed to all 28 community colleges, prorated on the base appropriations contained in part 1.

Sec. 213. The department of career development shall review the taxonomy of the 7 community colleges selected for the audit under section 212 that is based on the Activities Classification Structure Manual for Michigan Community Colleges, 1996 revision of the final report of the activities classification structure task force (July 1981), published by the department of education.

Sec. 214. (1) A community college shall retain certified class summaries, class lists, registration documents, and student transcripts that are consistent with the taxonomy of courses. For each enrollment period during the fiscal year, these certified documents shall identify clearly by course the number of in-district and out-of-district student credit and contact hours. The class summaries and class lists shall be consistent with each other and shall include the course prefix and numbers, course title, course credit and contact hours, credit and contact hours generated by each student, and activity classifications consistent with the taxonomy. An auditable process shall be used by the community college to determine the unduplicated head count for in-district students, out-of-district students, and prisoners for each enrollment period during the fiscal year.

(2) Contracts between the community college and agencies that reimburse the community college for the costs of instruction shall be retained for audit purposes.

Sec. 215. Each community college shall have an annual audit of all income and expenditures performed by an independent auditor and shall furnish the independent auditor's management letter and an annual audited accounting of all general and current funds income and expenditures including audits of college foundations to the legislature, the senate and house fiscal agencies, the auditor general, the department of career development, and the state budget director before November 15, 2001. If a community college fails to furnish the audit materials, the monthly state aid installments shall be withheld from that college until the information is submitted. All reporting shall conform to the requirements set forth in the Manual for Uniform Financial Reporting, Michigan Public Community Colleges, published by the Michigan state board of education in 1981, as amended by the department of career development.

Sec. 216. (1) A community college shall pay the employer's contributions to the Michigan public school employees' retirement system created by the public school employees retirement act of 1979, 1980 PA 300, MCL 38.1301 to 38.1408, as a condition of receiving money appropriated under this act. If amendments to the public school employees retirement act of 1979, 1980 PA 300, MCL 38.1301 to 38.1408, that require pre-funding of the health benefits portion of the Michigan public school employees' retirement system are enacted and take effect, those amendments apply to community colleges.

(2) A community college shall not pay an employer's contribution to more than 1 retirement fund providing benefits for an employee.

Sec. 217. An appropriation contained in this act shall not be used for the construction of buildings for, or operations of, a community college not expressly authorized in part 1. Money appropriated in part 1 shall not be used to pay for the construction or maintenance of a self-liquidating project.

Sec. 218. The department of career development shall ensure that a statistical report for minorities and women employees for the most recent school year, as submitted to the federal government, be included in the Michigan Community Colleges Enrollment Profile published by the department of career development. Also included in this profile shall be a statistical report for the most recent school year that includes enrollment statistics for minorities and women from the current year as submitted to the department of career development. The department of career development shall distribute a copy of this report to the state budget director and to members of the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on community colleges and the house and senate fiscal agencies no later than March 1, 2002.

Sec. 219. The department of treasury shall annually collect and compile data on the tax revenue losses to community colleges resulting from tax increment financing authorities (TIFA) and tax abatements. The department of treasury shall produce a report detailing the data. The report shall be completed and presented to the house and senate

appropriations subcommittees on community colleges, the department of career development, and the department of management and budget not later than February 15, 2002. The report shall include, but is not limited to, the following:

(a) Estimated revenue losses for each community college for the calendar year 2001.

(b) Confirmed revenue losses for each community college for the calendar years 1999 and 2000.

(c) Other requirements requested by the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on community colleges.

Sec. 221. (1) Each community college shall report the following to the department of career development, no later than November 1, 2001:

(a) The number of North American Indian students enrolled each term for the previous fiscal year, using guidelines and procedures developed by the department of career development and the Michigan commission on Indian affairs.

(b) The number of Indian tuition waivers granted each term, and the monetary value of the waivers for the previous fiscal year.

(2) Colleges shall use the criteria cited in 1976 PA 174, MCL 390.1251 to 390.1253, to determine eligibility for tuition waivers, and shall grant those waivers to individuals who meet the criteria and request tuition waivers.

(3) The department of career development shall compile the information received under subsection (1) and shall submit this compilation to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on community colleges, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the state budget director by January 7, 2002.

Sec. 222. From the general fund/general purpose appropriation in part 1 for renaissance zone reimbursement funding, there is allocated \$400,000.00 to make reimbursement to community colleges, as provided by section 12 of the Michigan renaissance zone act, 1996 PA 376, MCL 125.2692, for property taxes levied in 2001. Reimbursements shall be made in amounts to each eligible recipient no later than 60 days after the department of treasury certifies to the state budget director that it has received all necessary information to properly determine the amounts due each eligible recipient under section 12 of the Michigan renaissance zone act, 1996 PA 376, MCL 125.2692. Excess allocations lapse to the general fund.

Sec. 223. (1) Upon request, a community college shall inform interested Michigan high schools of the aggregate academic status of its students for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, in a manner prescribed by the Michigan community college association and in cooperation with the Michigan association of secondary school principals.

(2) Each community college shall report by December 1, 2001, to the department of career development, a summary of the information provided under subsection (1) for the prior academic year.

(3) The department of career development shall compile the information received under subsection (2) and shall submit this compilation to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on community colleges, the house and senate fiscal agencies, and the state budget director by February 1, 2002.

Sec. 224. (1) Recognizing the critical importance of education in strengthening Michigan's workforce, the legislature encourages the state's public community colleges to explore ways of increasing collaboration and cooperation with 4-year universities, particularly in the areas related to training, instruction, and program articulation.

(2) Community colleges shall report by December 1, 2001 to the department of career development on steps they have taken to increase collaboration and cooperation with 4-year universities under subsection (1).

(3) The department of career development shall compile the information received under subsection (2) and shall submit this compilation to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on community colleges and the senate and house fiscal agencies by January 7, 2002.

Sec. 225. The legislature intends that all citizens of this state have geographic and programmatic access to quality comprehensive community college services. The legislature and the Michigan community college association shall continue to review and analyze the recommendations made by the co-terminus task force to assure geographic and programmatic access to quality and comprehensive community college services. The legislature recognizes that as of January 1, 2001, there were also public universities that provide quality comprehensive community college services for citizens of this state who are not served by a community college district.

Sec. 226. Each community college shall report to the house and senate fiscal agencies and the department of career development a modification in credit or contact hour tuition or mandatory non-course-related student fees not later than 30 days after the modification is established by the college governing board.

Sec. 227. (1) Each community college shall report to the department of career development the numbers and type of associate degrees and other certificates awarded during the previous fiscal year. The report shall be made not later than November 15, 2001.

(2) The department of career development shall compile the information received under subsection (1) and shall submit this compilation to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on community colleges, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the state budget director by January 7, 2002.

Sec. 228. The legislature intends to achieve full funding of the Gast-Mathieu fairness in funding formula.

Sec. 229. (1) A community college receiving funding under this act and also subject to the student right-to-know and campus security act, Public Law 101-542, 104 Stat. 2381, shall make a copy of all material prepared in accordance with the public information reporting requirements under the crime awareness and campus security act of 1990, title II of the student right-to-know and campus security act, Public Law 101-542, 104 Stat. 2384, available in hard copy and electronic format accessible through the Internet for school districts, parents, and students.

(2) On the department website, the department of career development shall provide a hyperlink to the United States department of education website or provide access to a hard copy of information requested under subsection (1) for school districts, parents, and students. Upon request, the department of career development shall provide a hard copy of this information to the public.

Sec. 230. (1) A community college shall not expend money appropriated under this act to provide health care coverage for community college employees or their dependents for abortion services, other than for spontaneous abortion or to prevent the death of the woman upon whom the abortion is performed. A community college shall not approve a collective bargaining agreement or enter into any other employment contract that includes health care coverage for abortion services other than spontaneous abortion or to prevent the death of the woman upon whom the abortion is performed.

(2) If a community college expends money appropriated under this act in violation of subsection (1), the community college shall repay to this state an amount equal to the amount of money spent in violation of subsection (1).

Sec. 231. In light of sections 1, 3, and 4 of 1846 RS 83, MCL 551.1, 551.3, and 551.4, and section 1 of 1939 PA 168, MCL 551.271, the legislature intends that a community college receiving funding under this act shall not use part 1 money to extend employee benefits to the unmarried partners of the community college's employees except for pre- and post-natal costs.

Sec. 233. Community colleges that include prescription drugs and medications as a covered health benefit for adults are encouraged to ensure that payment for preventative contraceptives are included in the insurance plan.

Sec. 234. The legislature intends that each community college do all of the following:

(a) Undertake active measures to promote equal opportunities, eliminate discrimination, and foster a diverse student body and administration among all people including, but not limited to, women, minorities, seniors, veterans, and people with disabilities.

(b) Review, analyze, and eradicate activities that may tend to discriminate.

STATE AID - OPERATIONS

Sec. 301. Unless otherwise stated, all data items used in determining state aid in this act are as defined in the Manual for Uniform Financial Reporting, Michigan Public Community Colleges, published by the Michigan state board of education in 1981, which shall be the basis for reporting data, and the Activities Classification Structure Manual for Michigan Community Colleges, 1996 revision of the final report of the activities classification structure task force (July 1981), published by the department of education, which shall be used to document financial needs of the community colleges, as amended by the department of career development.

Sec. 302. A community college shall not include in the enrollment report any student credit hours or student contact hours for a student incarcerated in a Michigan penal institution. Exclusion of these students is intended to avoid the payment of state aid under this act for the same individuals for whom reimbursement is provided by the state correctional system.

GRANTS

Sec. 401. (1) The community college at-risk student success program is continued. The funding shall be prorated among community colleges based on the number of student contact hours for developmental and preparatory instruction reported by each community college to the department of career development for use in the Activities Classification Structure Manual for Michigan Community Colleges, 1996 revision of the final report of the activities classification structure task force (July 1981), published by the department of education. Of the amount appropriated in part 1 for the at-risk student success program, \$1,120,000.00 is allocated for base grants of \$40,000.00 each, to address the special needs of at-risk students at community colleges or the acquisition or upgrade of technology related equipment and software.

(2) Of the amount appropriated in part 1 for the at-risk student success program, the balance of the appropriated money shall be distributed on a proration utilizing the sum of the most recent 3 years developmental/preparatory contact hours divided by the sum of the 3-year total contact hours at each college. Each community college's percentage shall be divided by the sum of all the percentages systemwide to obtain each community college's prorated grant amount.

(3) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, the at-risk student success program money is allocated as follows:

(4) As used in this act, “at-risk students” means students who meet 1 or more of the following criteria:

(a) Are initially placed in 1 or more developmental courses as a result of standardized testing or as a result of failure to make satisfactory academic progress.

(b) Are diagnosed as learning disabled.

(c) Require English as a second language (ESL) assistance.

(5) Grant funding under this section shall be utilized to address the special needs of at-risk students or for equipment or upgrade of information technology hardware or software. Activities related to services provided to at-risk students include, but are not limited to, pretesting for academic ability, counseling contacts, and special programs. Equipment or information technology hardware or software purchased under this section need not be associated with the operation of a program designed to address the needs of at-risk students.

(6) Grant funding under this section shall not be used for indirect costs including, but not limited to, rent, utilities, or, except as provided in this section, college administration.

(7) Each community college shall report to the department of career development a summary of all accomplishments under, expenditures for, and compliance with the intent of this program, including the number of at-risk students served. The report is subject to audit as provided for in section 212(1). The report shall be submitted not later than 90 days after the end of the state’s fiscal year. The department of career development shall compile the information received under this subsection and shall submit this compilation to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on community colleges, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the state budget director by 120 days after the end of the state’s fiscal year.

(8) Each community college receiving grant money under this section shall, not more than 12 months after receipt of that money, certify to the state treasurer, the state budget director, the house and senate fiscal agencies, and the auditor general whether all the grant money is expended or encumbered.

Sec. 402. The legislature intends that any executive or legislative proposal or action, subsequent to the adoption of a recommendation for appropriations for community colleges for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, to increase appropriations to state-supported 4-year universities in excess of the governor’s original recommendation for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, will be accompanied by a similar action or proposal for state-supported community colleges.

Sec. 403. The legislature intends that not less than 70% of the economic development job training grant money be awarded to community colleges or a consortium of community colleges and other eligible applicants as provided in the budget that appropriated the economic development job training grant money. Further, the legislature intends that at least a portion of the total appropriation for economic development job training grants be awarded to community colleges that offer certified programs that are bureau of apprenticeship training certified. The Michigan economic development corporation shall report by November 1 of each year to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on community colleges and the senate and house fiscal agencies the names of the community colleges awarded grant money under this section, the amount of the grants awarded, and the percentage awarded to bureau of apprenticeship training certified programs.

Sec. 404. (1) The Michigan postsecondary access student scholarship (PASS) program is established to provide a PASS award as calculated under this section for a student who is eligible under subsection (2), (3), or (4). The Michigan higher education assistance authority (MHEAA) shall administer the PASS program, for which there is \$5,000,000.00 appropriated in part 1, and the PASS program shall comply with the requirements of this section.

(2) A student is eligible for a PASS award for the equivalent of 2 years of full-time college enrollment if the student meets all of the following:

(a) The student must be a Michigan resident enrolled in a program leading to an associate degree that was in existence as of January 1, 2000, at a Michigan public community college, Michigan public university, or Michigan independent nonprofit, degree-granting college or university.

(b) The student must be enrolled at least half-time.

(c) The student must have scored at level 1 or level 2 on the high school Michigan education assessment program (MEAP) tests in reading, writing, mathematics, and science.

(d) The student must be eligible for a federal Pell grant.

(e) Other requirements established by the MHEAA.

(3) A student who meets all the requirements of subsection (2), other than subsection (2)(c), but has taken the high school MEAP tests in reading, writing, mathematics, and science while in high school shall receive a PASS award for 1 year of college enrollment. If the student maintains satisfactory academic progress in that first year of college enrollment, the student shall receive a PASS award for a second year of college enrollment.

(4) A student who meets all the requirements of subsection (2), other than subsection (2)(c), shall receive a maximum \$500.00 PASS award, not to exceed tuition and fees, for the second year of college enrollment. A student may qualify under this section whether or not the student took any of the high school MEAP tests.

(5) PASS award eligibility is limited to 2 semesters or 3 terms in any academic year.

(6) A PASS award for a student eligible under subsection (2), (3), or (4) shall be calculated by the MHEAA as the amount remaining after subtracting from the value of the student's allowable tuition and fees, as prescribed in subsection (8), all of the following state and federal financial educational assistance for which that student is eligible:

(a) Michigan competitive scholarship.

(b) Michigan tuition grant.

(c) Pell grant.

(d) Federal hope scholarship tax credit.

(7) Each higher education institution shall prepare and utilize a tax credit table, or shall notify the MHEAA that the institution chooses to have the MHEAA utilize the department of treasury's tax credit table, to impute an amount under subsection (6) for the federal hope scholarship tax credit.

(8) The value of a student's allowable tuition and fees is as follows:

(a) For a student enrolled at a Michigan community college, the value of allowable tuition and fees is the in-district tuition and fees. For a student who does not reside within a community college district, the value of allowable tuition and fees is the out-of-district tuition and fees for the community college that the student is attending.

(b) For a student enrolled at a Michigan public university, the value of allowable tuition and fees is 125% of the highest in-district tuition and fees for community colleges for the immediately preceding academic year as reported before August 1 after that academic year.

(c) For a student enrolled at a Michigan independent, nonprofit, degree-granting college or university, the value of allowable tuition and fees is 125% of the highest in-district tuition and fees for community colleges for the immediately preceding academic year as reported before August 1 after that academic year.

(9) The MHEAA shall remit an eligible student's PASS award to a higher education institution in accordance with procedures established by the MHEAA.

(10) The PASS award may be utilized by the student to pay costs of attendance as determined by the MHEAA.

(11) The PASS program shall not be applied for a student's theology or divinity courses.

(12) The MHEAA shall develop an application and eligibility determination process that ensures that all of the requirements prescribed by this section are met.

(13) Students who are expected to receive a tuition incentive program scholarship are not eligible for the PASS program.

(14) The MHEAA shall submit to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on community colleges, the house and senate fiscal agencies, and the department of management and budget by March 1, 2002, a comprehensive report on the PASS program from December 31, 2000 to February 1, 2002, including, but not limited to:

(a) Number of PASS program recipients by college.

(b) Average PASS award per student, including minimum and maximum, by college.

(c) Total PASS program expenditures.

(d) Other applicable PASS program information, including, but not limited to, the estimated PASS program and cost impact of removing age restrictions and of raising the income eligibility amount.

(15) The department of treasury shall advertise the PASS program on the Michigan higher education assistance authority website.

Sec. 405. If section 274 of the income tax act of 1967, 1967 PA 281, MCL 206.274, is repealed, \$5,166,447.00 is appropriated for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002 for community colleges. The \$5,166,447.00 shall be added to the base appropriation for each community college and shall be allocated as follows:

Rep. Callahan, having reserved the right to explain his protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

We should not dip into the budget stabilization fund without exhausting every other means. This is a poor approach to balancing the budget. We should re-visit the SBT elimination. We should re-visit the personal income tax reduction schedule. We should back off the E-Mich program and stop the 100 million Supreme Court House. We need the BSF for true rainy days.”

Rep. Kolb, having reserved the right to explain his protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted ‘no’ on SB 463, because I believe that the Michigan Legislature has not explored all sources of funding to address the budget shortfalls, nor have we had a thorough discussion of our funding priorities. We should consider a short term suspension of our previously approved tax cuts, our continuing to pour money into e-Michigan, and capital projects like the \$100 million Supreme Court Building. We should consider the amount of revenues needed to fund our priorities, like early childhood development programs, educational programs, higher education, health care, environmental protection, and programs for our seniors and veterans. Then we need to consider how much is needed from the Budget Stabilization Fund, how much should come from suspension of our tax cut programs (should we suspend them for one year?), the transfer of unused funds in e-Michigan, and the potential suspension of capital projects. But those alternative sources of revenue were not looked at. Thus, I could not support this bill.”

Rep. Jamnick, having reserved the right to explain her protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House: During the 1999-2000 session, as a member of the House Tax Policy Committee, I repeatedly cautioned us about continuing to approve legislation which would have a negative impact on Michigan’s revenue stream. Late in that session both House and Senate Tax Policy Committee Chairs were cautioning about the ‘erratic receipts of Michigan’s revenues’. Here we are today being requested to approve transferring \$77 million to the General Fund for our current fiscal year and \$155 million for the next fiscal year and an additional up to \$50 million for this current fiscal year if needed to ensure a zero balance in the General Fund. I question the priorities being funded through these transfers as well as a real opportunity for the minority caucus to have any fruitful input at this time. We should be coming together as a total legislative body to meet the needs of Michigan’s

people. There is no fiscal responsibility to consider a withdrawal for the next fiscal year at this time as no consensus revenue estimates have been agreed to and the State's economic condition could improve substantially over the next six months to a year."

Whereas, Donald S. Lopez, deputy director of the National Air and Space Museum, has been with the Smithsonian since 1972. He came to the Museum as assistant director for the Aeronautics Department. At that time, he became part of the team, led by Michael Collins, which was responsible for planning the construction and opening of the National Air and Space Museum. As assistant director for Aeronautics, Mr. Lopez was instrumental in developing the exhibits that welcomed visitors at the Museum's opening on July 1, 1976. These exhibits have made it the most visited museum in the world; and

Whereas, Mr. Lopez was appointed deputy director in 1983, a position he held until 1990. He then served as senior advisor to the director before retiring in 1993. From 1993 to 1996 Donald Lopez served as senior advisor emeritus. He was reappointed deputy director in 1996; and

Whereas, During World War II, Donald Lopez served in China, flying Curtiss P-40s and North American P-51s under General Clare Chennault. After the war, he attended the Air Force Test Pilot School. He spent almost six years testing fighters and completed a short combat tour flying North American F-86's in Korea. Following a tour at the Pentagon, he earned a bachelor's degree in aeronautical engineering at the Air Force Institute of Technology. He spent the next five years at the U.S. Air Force Academy as an associate professor of aeronautics and chief of academic counseling. After his retirement from the U.S. Air Force in 1964, Donald Lopez worked as a systems engineer on the Apollo-Saturn Launch Vehicle and the Skylab Orbital Workshop for Bellcomm, Inc; and

Whereas, Donald S. Lopez is a member of the American Fighter Association, the Experimental Aircraft Association, and is a Fellow of the Royal Aeronautical Society. In 1995, the National Aeronautic Association named him an Elder Statesman of Aviation. He was presented the 1999 Federal Hispanic Heritage Month Excellence in Leadership Award; now, therefore, be it

Whereas, John R. (Jack) Dailey, retired United States Marine Corps general and pilot, assumed the duties of director of the National Air Space Museum in January 2000. General Dailey came to the Museum from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, where he had been the Associates Deputy Administrator since retiring from the United States Marine Corps in 1992. At NASA, he led the Agency's reinvention activities; and

Whereas, General Dailey was born on February 17, 1934, in Quantico, Virginia, and earned his bachelor of science degree at the University of California, Los Angeles, in 1956. He and his wife, the former Mimi Rodian of Copenhagen, Denmark, live in Fairfax, Virginia. They have two adult children, Lisa Bader and Nils Dailey; and

Whereas, John R. Dailey's career in the Marine Corps spanned thirty-six years and included extensive command and staff experience. He has flown over 6,000 hours in a wide variety of aircraft and helicopters. During two tours in Vietnam, he flew 450 missions. He was promoted to the rank of general and named Assistant Commandant of the Marine Corps in 1990 and received numerous personal decorations for his service in the Marine Corps and NASA; and

Whereas, While at NASA, General Dailey served on the President's Management Council, co-chaired the Aeronautics and Astronautics Coordinating Board, and was a national delegate to the Research and Technology Organization supporting NATO. He also serves as national commander of the Marine Corps Aviation Association and is a member of the Early and Pioneer Naval Aviators Association "Golden Eagles"; and

Whereas, General Dailey will be leading the effort to open a 710,000 square-foot facility at Washington Dulles International Airport, which will display more than 180 aircraft and 100 spacecraft currently in storage; and

Whereas, The National Air and Space Museum, which opened in 1976, is home to many of the "firsts" in aviation and space history, including the Wright brothers' Flyer, the Spirit of St. Louis, and the Apollo 11 command module Columbia. With nearly 10 million visitors a year, it is the most popular museum in the world; now, therefore, be it

Whereas, When the United States entered the Vietnam conflict, the Hmong were considered its potential trustworthy allies. It began recruiting, financing, training, and equipping tens of thousands of Hmong, some as young as ten years old to fight as special guerrilla units against the Communist Pathet Lao and North Vietnamese regular forces; and

Whereas, During the entire Vietnam War between 1961 and 1975, the Hmong Special Guerrilla Units (SGU), widely known as the U.S. "Secret Army", were among America's staunchest and most loyal allies fighting the "Secret War" in Laos. They fought valiantly with extraordinary courage along side U.S. Armed Forces, which included the U.S. Air commandos, U.S. Special Forces, Ravens, Air America, and the CIA, against communist expansionism to simultaneously protect their own freedom, protect the sovereignty of Laos, and to defend U.S. policy and its interests in Southeast Asia; and

Whereas, The Hmong SGU provided safeguard for U.S. personnel, guarded U.S. Air Force radar installations, gathered critical intelligence about enemy operations and positions, served as vital communication links for American Armed Forces engaging in strategic bombing missions, and risked their lives conducting rescue missions to save the lives of many downed American pilots. The Hmong SGU engaged in both conventional battles and tactical guerrilla actions while Lao-Hmong pilots flew American warplanes in tens of thousands of deadly combat missions bombing enemy positions where more than half of the Hmong pilots courageously died. In brief summary, the Hmong SGU served as the primary anti-Communist force in Laos and bore the brunt of ground fighting and casualties in support of American forces, often under the most difficult of circumstances. As a result of the "Secret War", an estimated 35,000 Hmong men lost their lives for the cause of freedom; and

Whereas, Upon the United States withdrawal in 1975, the Communist began a vicious campaign of revenge and acts of genocide against the Hmong. As a consequence, these patriotic Hmong became victims and refugees. Out of an estimated population of roughly 350,000, tens of thousands fled to Thailand camps while thousands were ambushed, massacred, robbed, and drowned in the Mekong River. The rest were left behind to live under the mercy of their arch enemy, the Communist regime, where thousands were sent to harsh concentration camps to die in vain without proper burial ceremonies; and

Whereas, From Thailand, many were eventually permitted to come to the country they once fought faithfully for, the United States of America. However, due to the government secrecy over the nature of the so-called "Secret War" the Lao-Hmong personal sacrifices, enormous contributions, and severe losses had been kept secret from the general American public for thirty-five years, until the first U.S. official "Lao-Hmong American Recognition Day". This took place in the city of Golden, Colorado, on July 22, 1995; and

Whereas, For the first time in history, in their honor, the distinguished Vietnam Veterans National Medals and Congressional Citations were symbolically bestowed upon some of the surviving Lao-Hmong veterans of the Special Guerrilla Units of the Vietnam War. The 6th Annual Commemoration of the Laotian-American Recognition Day, for the first time ever in the state of Michigan will be observed on Saturday, July 21, 2001; and

Whereas, This event coincides with the 26th anniversary year commemorating the withdrawal of American forces from Southeast Asia after the war and is being hosted by the Lao-Hmong American Coalition, Michigan Chapter. This event will culminate in both a daytime and evening affair. The daytime event takes place at the Pontiac Silverdome between 10:00 a.m and 2:00 p.m. The evening event will be held at the Troy Marriott between 5:00 p.m. and 12:00 a.m. This commemoration is sponsored and supported by the city of Pontiac, Oakland County Veteran groups, businesses, members of the Lao-Hmong American Coalition, and members of the Hmong community in the state of Michigan; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of this legislative body honor the Hmong; and be it further

Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Lao-Hmong American Coalition, Michigan Chapter in appreciation for all the acts of allegiance, heroism and patriotism shown to their adopted country, the United States of America, as a token of our high esteem.

Clearly, it is appropriate for state authorities to do all they can to address these legitimate concerns and assure a fair resolution of this problem; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we urge the Department of Management and Budget to ensure accessibility to parking at fair rates for state employees being transferred to the Cadillac Place facility in Detroit; and be it further

The question being on agreeing to the title of the bill,

Rep. Patterson moved to amend the title to read as follows:

A bill to establish procedures for municipalities to designate individual lots or structures as blighting; to purchase or condemn blighting property; to transfer blighting property for development; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

The motion prevailed.

The House agreed to the title as amended.

Rep. Richardville moved that the bill be given immediate effect.

The motion prevailed, 2/3 of the members serving voting therefor.

Rep. Drolet, having reserved the right to explain his protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

This bill comes to us artfully decorated with noble euphemisms to disguise its malignant purpose. It would give local governments subjective powers to identify and target private property for confiscation. Purporting to offer a legal

definition for ‘blighting property’, it only vaguely defines the concept, leaving most of the critical components up to the arbitrary authority of local ordinances and employees. The state legislature should be a principle protector of private property. With imprecise language and unclear standards, the bill would absolve the state of this crucial responsibility.

However, the bill is very clear when it establishes what is to be done with the confiscated property—it is to be used for and by large commercial developers. When local governments want to throw up municipal buildings, casinos and new sports stadiums, this bill is the axe that will be used to chop down the rights of the smaller landowners standing in their way.

So, if a grossly neglected and depraved property is geographically distant from the urban development planners’ big picture, then we can be reasonably certain that it will long avoid this bill’s loose definition of ‘blighting property’. However, when marginally well kept up buildings stand in the path of Big Brother’s vision of ‘progress’, then the nebulous standards in this new law will be quickly twisted so as to clear troublesome small property owners from that path of progress. Government will be empowered to apply whatever standards it deems necessary, whenever and wherever it needs land.

Private property and the right to equal protection under the law are bedrock, non-negotiable, pillars upon which a market economy is built. If a state government in this country cannot uphold these concepts, then it is difficult for me to envision precisely why it is necessary to have one.”

Rep. Middaugh, having reserved the right to explain her protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

Although I understand that blighting property can be a very real problem in many communities, I believe local municipalities currently have options through local ordinances to deal with them. Under this bill a municipality could condemn property and take title to the property for an offense such as an “unsafe fence.” I believe this gives too much power to local municipalities at the expense of property owners.”

Reps. Cameron Brown and Vander Roest having reserved the right to explain their protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I realize that H.B. 4028 attempts to correct the real problem of urban blight, but it does so in a manner that wrongly challenges property rights. “Unsafe fences,” for instance, create in my mind a sense that the legislation may be somewhat extreme. I believe that local zoning and local ordinances exist to address these problems without adding another layer of law.”

I am voting against this budget because of the priorities in funding for one reason, but additionally, this is my third year trying to have this Department work with me on a problem in my District relating to independent living placements of juveniles in local communities. This has been a long time issue which predates my time serving in the legislature. The director of the Department has mislead me and has put the placement of juveniles over the safety of the community they are being placed in. The Department has not been inclined to work with these local communities to deal with issues which could be resolved and create a winning situation for the youths, community of placement, the department and the people of our State.”

Reps. Lemmons, Garza, Zelenko, Spade, Hale, Gielegem, Murphy, Minore, Waters, Wojno, Dennis, Kolb, Williams, Lipsey, Adamini, Rich Brown, Phillips, Daniels, Schauer, Neumann, Clark, Hardman, Reeves, Lockwood, Anderson, Jacobs, Whitmer and Callahan, having reserved the right to explain their nay vote, made the following statement:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted no on the Conference Report to Senate Bill 235, the Family Independence Agency Budget because this bill does not address the true needs of the children, families and individuals it is supposed to service.

This bill does not hold the Family Independence Agency fiscally responsible for the past year of fiscal mismanagement, overspending and negligence towards serving working families who do not qualify for day care. This bill does not allow for the expansion of day care to many families who are over the income requirements by a few dollars. It squanders \$32.5 million in TANF dollars by supplanting \$18 million in federal money and eliminating \$14 million in General Fund dollars. That’s an \$18 million dollar cut in services because of fiscal mismanagement.

This budget bill as reported out of conference offers no increased support for grandparents and relatives who are caring for their grandchildren on a few dollars that barely pay for diapers and formula. Grandparents are saving the state millions in foster care payments. We voted to give them a small 2 percent increase. The Conference Report takes that away from them, and from disability recipients, child placement agencies and adoption agencies.

Finally, this Conference Report allows the Family Independence Agency to eliminate the Prevention Services Program which is a primary resource for families in trouble and a risk of disintegration. We have frozen payments to relatives who have stepped in to help out troubled families, we have denied families access to affordable day care and now we are allowing for the removal of a program that provides a needed and effective service to families in trouble.

We have put the budget burden on the backs of the children and on the families responsible for their care.”
